synopsis

The 39 Steps by Patrick Barlow is a heart-stopping noir thriller based on Hitchcock's 1935 murder-mystery masterpiece and John Buchan's juicy spy novel! This wonderfully deranged comedy features five actors, playing a multitude of roles using fast-paced fun, thrilling action and riotous invention.

Set in 1930s London, the story follows the painfully British and devastatingly handsome, Richard Hannay, who finds himself in the clutches of a mysterious woman, Anabella Schmidt, who has uncovered a plot called "The 39 Steps". Before you know it, Richard becomes a notorious fugitive, hurtled from London to Scotland's most remote highlands, jumping through windows and onto trains as he tries to escape spies and cunning murderers, before finding love whilst handcuffed to a beautiful woman. Will he save Britain from a den of devious spies? Will he uncover the mystery of the 39 steps and clear his name before it's too late?

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Four years ago I came across Patrick Barlow's 'The 39 Steps' for the first time when choosing a play for my Year 10 Drama students. We had so much fun reading the play and staging scenes together, that I knew I just had to direct this play one day! Then while on Maternity Leave in 2020, I got a very random Facetime call from two of my ex-drama students, Robyn and Michael, who called just to share that they missed doing theatre — and that, my dear friends, was all I needed to hear to finally kick off my dream of starting a theatre company of my own — and thus, Introspect Theatre Company was born.

However, starting up a theatre company in 2020 has meant facing a number of unexpected hurdles in this new world of lockdowns, masks, social distancing, quarantines, essential services, and so on. But this is not a challenge that I will easily shy away from, as bringing theatre to my community will always be something I will keep fighting for, as it allows people to laugh and cry together, learn about humanity, history, and culture, while also fostering creativity and expression. I was so saddened to see how quickly theatre was pushed to the wayside in this new world of ours and realised the need for a theatre revival. And if there ever was a play that celebrates the essence of theatre and its power to bring joy and spontaneous hoots and guffaws, it's The 39 Steps!

Now, this is not the year to take financial risks when it comes to the arts, so for us this has meant the cast and crew wearing multiple hats, including Emmilyne acting as not just our stage manager, but our designer, props master and assistant production manager as well, Cein (Richard Hannay) assisting with sound design, Michael being our graphics designer (Clown 1), Ashley (Clown 2) building our set, and Robyn (Pamela) our assistant director. It also meant rehearsing in our garages, particularly on the evenings I was in charge of looking after my toddler and rehearsing at the same time. I have been so blessed with such an understanding cast, despite being interrupted by crying heard through the baby monitor (usually right in the middle of a dramatic moment), or having to work on scenes without me because he'd refuse to go to sleep! I know for certain that if it weren't for these passionate, tenacious, and hard-working individuals, we wouldn't be where we are today, putting on this thrilling show as a tight-knit little family!

Artistic Director & Actress

Cindy Sykes is the Artistic Director for Introspect Theatre Company and is also a Drama Teacher, having taught for seven years. She has directed over a dozen theatre productions over the years, including the musicals *Annie Jr* and *Smithy*. Oscar Wilde's *The Importance of Being Earnest*, <u>Huck Finn by Greg Banks</u>, <u>Angela</u>

Betzien's The Teenage Alchemist, Voices in the Crowd of Verbatim play she devised with a group of high school students, and Mismatched Letters by Sebastian Roncallo, which she workshopped and helped translate. This year she directed UNRAVEL, a Forum Theatre performance with young people. She has also performed in theatre productions with El Telon Theatre Company, as well as in Brisbane Arts Theatre's musical parody of Jurassic Park and Brisbane Musical Theatre's Les Miserables. In 2018, she completed her Master of Applied Theatre Studies, focusing her research on building resilience through drama and theatre. In 2021 she presented her findings at the Australia VISION Conference, encouraging others to effect change in their community through the arts.

Emmilyne is a young, passionate artist currently based in Brisbane, Australia.
